Lorin Tarr Gill was a well known Hawaii naturalist, environmental educator and social worker. Considered by many to be the father of environmental education in the islands, Gill introduced thousands of young people to the natural world through mountain hikes and a camp education program.

Lorin served as the Director of Palama Settlement and helped found the Hawaii Chapter of the Sierra Club. With the Moanalua Gardens Foundation and Papahana Kuaola, he helped create programs to teach geology, natural history and botany to children throughout the State.

Born in Honolulu on July 2nd, 1928, Lorin Gill graduated from Roosevelt High School in 1946, and went on to receive his bachelor's and master's degrees in social work from the University of Hawaii.
