

THE 'ILI OF EAST WAILUA - MOLOKAI  
AS PER LAHELA NAKI

- Keice Koia + old hantamaster's house etc
- Ahūā gathered paia for shipment to Kalahepa Pāwaa (old school site)
- Kukuinui Lakaolo's father-in-law's 2 story house
- Mokulehua Nāki taro loi ('ai uai)
- Kōpena County "road" merges w/ present trail
- Lauhouka wide graded trail
- Pōhaku hūna
- Ululala last loi to <sup>be</sup> cultivated (spring)
- Palāloa first pen perennial stream - oriental bamboo
- Keankou mango trees + "Big Pond"
- Maukakōpe 'Oke Hawaii - stream on Mahe Boundary route to Maui Falls
- Pāhala <sup>'ili</sup> extends across valley
- Mālama cultivation from here to sea in 1910 (John Kano)
- Pōkiukaha mark kōpua stone
- Māia loa ends in 'ape
- Pōhaku kahakaha starts w/ conglomerate in stream - breccia
- Waihā starts w/ "Big O'opu pool" - Waihana Stream junction  
- dike in stream bed crossing
- Olona Pōhaku "lauāu"
- Kopu'ibi ~~spring~~ spring - camping area - cross Waiakua Stream
- Kekama ends with start of ridge trail
- Pōke alii point where ridge levels for a bit
- Hauuawai ferny glen where ridge starts to climb again
